

Exploring new strategies to help plants facing abiotic and biotic stresses is nowadays becoming even more crucial. Therefore the main aim of our Summer school is to improve students knowledge and awareness on this important topic, through lectures, workshops and discussions.

The SIBV/TOMRES Summer school 2020 will:

- Provide students knowledge on **novel research aspects**, including innovative techniques, in academic and industrial field. Lectures will be held by international experts, which will share and discuss their experiences;
- help participants improving their communication skills and critical thinking, through discussion tables, speed-date discussions with the speakers, poster sessions and workshops. Students will also be required to introduce their research projects with a poster and a brief oral presentation.
- give participants the opportunity to build a valuable **network** with speakers and students from different countries and research fields, encouraging a friendly social environment.

The organisers: SIBV is the Italian Society of Plant Biology, gathering Italian scientists active in the fields of molecular, cellular and whole-plant biology; TOMRES (Improving tomato resilience to combined drought and nutrient stress) is a EU H2020 project counting 25 partners throughout Europe.

Who can participate: max 50 PhD students and young researchers

The course will be held in English and is addressed to PhD students and young researchers in the fields of Plant Biology, Physiology, Biotechnology and Molecular Breeding.

Registration terms and fees

Registrations will open on March 9th, 2020 and close on April 15th, 2020.

Applicants will provide an **abstract** of their research.

The participation fee will include course material, full board accommodation and social events. Scholarships will be available and details will be provided before start of registration.
